# Local Westonia families host city Medical Students.

Last week the Wheatbelt welcomed medical students from Notre Dame and Curtin University as part of an immersion program with the aim of addressing a state-wide regional doctor shortage.

Over the four days, the students immersed themselves in rural life, billeted with local families across seven Wheatbelt towns – Bruce Rock, Cunderdin, Kellerberrin, Merredin, Narrogin, Southern Cross and Westonia – to learn about the realities and daily challenges faced by regionally located families.

The Program was developed in an effort to shift student perceptions about rural medicine early in their studies. Studies show a link between early exposure to rural medicine and a willingness to practice medicine in a rural location. This program offers students a unique opportunity to immerse themselves in rural medicine and to truly understand the challenges and needs of remotely located communities.

The immersion experience included three circuits covering the entire Wheatbelt with students remaining in their respective circuits for the duration of the Program.

They visited a number of hospitals, health services, GPs and primary schools. The Shire and local families were looking forward to personally hosting the students.

During the four days, students will participated in a range of activities including visits to the local hospital and medical practices, holding teddy bear clinics with students at the local primary school. They even visited Jimmy's Hut!!!

The Students were presented with an official Council tie or scarf at a thank-you function on Thursday where students then provided the locals with their thoughts of their stay and "new views" on rural medicine.

# Notice of Intention to Lay 1080 Poison in the Westonia Common.



Notice is hereby provided that the Shire of Westonia intends to lay 1080 poison baits in the Westonia Common for the control of foxes and rabbits.


The baiting programme is due to commence after Wednesday, 27 March 2019 and be completed by Saturday, 11 May 2019.

Please be advised that 1080 is highly toxic. The consumption of an animal that has ingested a lethal or sub-lethal dose of 1080 poses a serious risk of secondary poisoning to humans and other species. Taking of carcasses, removal of hides, and shooting or trapping animals (for human or animal consumption) is prohibited during the baiting period and for at least 14 days after the completion of the baiting program.

Please ensure children and other persons in your care are restricted from entering the site of baiting. Please restrain your pets, working dogs and stock to avoid the possibility of poisoning through direct baiting or through eating 1080 poisoned animals.

#### Roadworks

A 1.2km section of Warrachuppin Road (located between mine entrance and Townrow's gateway) has been transformed with a trail of a Polycom product that is mixed with the existing gravel surface. Polycom provides a tighter bind to the gravel to reduce corrugation as well as act as a dust suppressant. The Polycom product is not cheap but if the trail is successful the Council will likely introduce the product on other high traffic gravel surfaces to

get greater longevity on the running surface.

The works crew have mobilised to the M040 to commence reconstruction of another 2.2km section of bitumen surface West of the Warralakin townsite and just short of the Echo Valley Road intersection. The existing bitumen surface will be scarified with gravel heaps remaining in place for short periods before levelling and final trimming. The heaps will be well signed and all road users are asked to adhere to the traffic management measures for the safety of all.

Various sections of Morrison Road have been carted with the stockpiling of gravel heaps waiting to be levelled and graded once the construction crew can mobilise to site to complete works.

A drains and batters program is being undertaken by the maintenance grader on roads south of the highway.

#### **Townsite Footpaths**

Council have noticed that several local residents are making it common practise to park their vehicles on the asphalt footpaths adjacent to their properties. Footpaths are provided for pedestrian access particularly children, people with mobility issues and mothers with prams etc. Council ask that some courtesy be extended to pedestrians and that the practise of parking on footpaths be ceased.
