Footpath reconstruction will be carried out on a section of Wolfram Street over the next couple of months prior to some additional streetscape initiatives that will continue to improve the amenity for the community.

Roadworks

The construction crew have completed a 3.5km section of South Walgoolan Road and a 1km section of 6 Mile Gate Road with the Polymer stabilizing product.

A 4.6km section of Warralakin Road has had its old bitumen surface removed in preparation for new reconstruction works which will harvest commence in January once is completed.

The crew will be reconstructing the Carrabin South/Clothier Road intersection over the next two weeks.

Share what living in the Wheatbelt is like with **doctors of the future**

One hundred medical students will be coming to the Wheatbelt in March 2023. During their stay, they will visit local farms, industry, general practices, hospitals and schools, and participate in community activities.

We need you to provide real-life experiences that will give them an understanding of what it is like to live in the Wheatbelt and perhaps inspire them to become rural doctors.

Some students continue to keep in touch and visit their host families, some return to do seasonal work and placements, others have joined mentoring programs, some have inspired host family members to pursue tertiary studies in health and medicine, and some students are now doctors in the Wheatbelt and other parts of rural/remote WA and Australia.

Mosquito Management Notice

During the summer months or warmer weather each year, the Shire of Westonia carries out a fogging program to help suppress the presence of mosquitoes in and around town. The active chemical within the 'fog' is called Aqua K-Othrine which is used by many Local Governments and State Government Agencies around Western Australia.

The fogging program usually commences in October and will cease in/around April of each year, depending on the temperatures and general weather conditions.

As the practice is weather dependent, fogging dates and frequency may vary from week to week, you will however, you will hear the machine operating, usually around dusk (from 5.30pm – 7pm) up to 3 times a week.

If you become aware of the Shire fogging down your street, if possible, move indoors. If your evaporative air conditioner is in operation at the time, it is best to turn the fan off for the duration of the event (it is fine to keep the water component of the airconditioner running). It is also advised to switch off any reverse cvcle airconditioners. and doors ensure and windows are closed for the duration of the fogging procedure (approx. 30 min). Aqua K -Othrine chemical with similar is а properties to that of household flyspray and while it is not toxic to humans, it is advised that exposure to the 'fog' should be limited if practicable.

We also take this time to thank Dave Hamilton (fossil) for his continued volunteer works to spray our town.

PREVENT MOSQUITO BITES

Many mosquitoes bite around dusk and dawn,

but some can bite day and night. The only way to prevent mosquito-borne disease is to avoid being bitten. Know how to prevent mosquito bites – cover up, repel, clean up.



Cover up



Wear long, loose-fitting, light coloured clothing, covering as much of the body as you can. Mosquitoes can bite through tight clothes like jeans. Make sure children are also appropriately covered up.

Repel

Use <u>insect repellent</u> containing DEET (diethyltoluamide) or picaridin and always follow instructions on the label.



Clean up

Stop mosquitoes breeding in water pooling around your home or holiday accommodation by emptying water from containers.
