




AVAILABILITY OF ANNUAL REPORT 2021/22 and ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING OF ELECTORS

The consolidated local laws are also available on the Shire's website.

The local law was published in the Government Gazette on 23 May 2023

The consolidated local laws are also available on the Shire's website. The local law was published in the Government Gazette on 23 May 2023.





We endeavor to bring a range of art workshops to the community. Both locals and visitors are welcome to attend.


