

RESIDENTIAL KERBSIDE CONTAINER REFUNDS COMING SOON TO THE WESTONIA TOWNSITE!!



CHECK FOR THE 10¢ MARK

It's easy to save your 10¢ containers from landfill so they can live another life – just check for the 10¢ mark!

Most aluminium, glass, plastic, steel, and liquid paperboard drink containers that are 150ml to 3L are accepted.

This includes:

- Most single-serve water and fizzy drink containers up to and including 3L.
- Most single-serve alcohol containers, like beer bottles and pre-mixed spirits.
 - Flavoured milk containers that are 150ml to 999ml.
- Coconut water, pure fruit, or vegetable juice containers that are 150ml to 999ml.

Make sure you take off the lids — we recycle those too, just separately.



HOW WILL IT WORK?

YOU WILL BE GIVEN A 120L CONTAINERS FOR CHANGE BIN TO DEPOSIT YOUR ELIGIBLE EMPTIES INTO. ON PICK UP DAYS, YOU'LL PUT YOUR BIN OUT AND WE'LL EMPTY YOUR CONTAINERS INTO A COLLECTION BAG. THEN, WE TAKE YOUR CONTAINERS TO THE DEPOT TO COUNT AND ISSUE YOUR REFUND.

WHEN WILL THE COLLECTIONS BE?

WE ARE WAITING ON THE ARRIVAL OF THE BINS, WHICH ARE MADE IN SOUTH AUSTRALIA. WE EXPECT THEM TO ARRIVE IN PERTH IN LATE OCTOBER, SO HOPE TO HAVE OUR FIRST COLLECTION IN DECEMBER 2023 OR JANUARY 2024.

WE WILL ISSUE A HANDY COLLECTION CALENDAR SOON.

WHO GETS MY REFUND?

YOU CAN GET A PERSONAL REFUND OR SELECT A CHARITY VIA YOUR MEMBER NUMBER, OR YOU CAN DONATE IT TO THE WESTONIA PROGRESS ASSOCIATION, WHO WILL USE AND DISTRIBUTE THE FUNDS TO BENEFIT OF THE COMMUNITY.

WHAT DO I DO WITH MY CONTAINERS BEFORE THEN?

DEPOSIT BAGGED OR BOXED CONTAINERS IN THE BAG DROP POINT (BEHIND THE OLD CWA BUILDING). USING YOUR MEMBER NUMBER, YOU CAN RECEIVE A PERSONAL REFUND OR YOU CAN DONATE TO A GROUP OR CHARITY OF YOUR CHOICE BY WRITING DOWN THEIR MEMBER NUMBER.

YOU CAN COLLECT BAGS AND TAGS AT THE WESTONIA GENERAL STORE, BUT ANY STURDY BAG OR BOX WILL DO.

YOU CAN ALSO DEPOSIT LOOSE CONTAINERS INTO THE DONATION BINS THERE, WITH THE PROCEEDS GOING TO THE PARNANA PIKURTU WILDLIFE SANCTUARY.


