OLD PRIMARY SCHOOL CLEAN-UP

A significant clean-up of the Old Primary School grounds has been undertaken since the Council has taken back possession of the property from the Highway/MRWA lease arrangement in preparation for the proposed upgrades in the new financial year, subject to successful funding outcomes. This will be ongoing over the next few months.









The construction crew are part way through the reconstruction of a 3.6km section of the Warralakin Road between the M040 and Daddow Roads. This has involved new drainage, removal of old seal, gravel resheeting the total length and will soon be receiving a water binding treatment prior to a new 2 coat seal in early March.

POOR WATER PRESSURE IN TOWNSITE

The Council has noticed a further reduction in the water pressure in the townsite which has been pretty ordinary at best for sometime.

A formal complaint has been lodged by the Council with the Water Corporation who are making some investigations on the matter.

We have on several occasions over the years contacted the Water Corporation about the towns water pressure without any noticeable improvement.

Council are keen to lodge a whole of community formal complaint with a petition signed by all residents affected so we might get some better results.

The petition will be in the front office of the administration building if you wish to participate. The stronger the community response will hopefully get some results.

PREVENT MOSQUITO BITES

Many mosquitoes bite around dusk and dawn, but some can bite day and night. The only way to prevent mosquito-borne disease is to avoid being bitten. Know how to prevent mosquito bites – cover up, repel, clean up.



Cover up



Wear long, loose-fitting, light coloured clothing, covering as much of the body as you can. Mosquitoes can bite through tight clothes like jeans. Make sure children are also appropriately covered up.

Repel



Use <u>insect repellent</u> containing DEET (diethyltoluamide) or picaridin and always follow instructions on the label.

Clean up



Stop mosquitoes breeding in water pooling around your home or holiday accommodation by emptying water from containers.


