25TH ANZAC DAY COMMEMORATIVE ADDRESS **APRIL 2024**

Good morning. It has been 111 years since the start of World War 1. 109 years since this very day in Gallipoli. Please bear with me to listen to the statistics. Those statistics being our family, our friends, and the reason we are standing here today.

The Australian Expeditionary Forces was the first Australian military unit raised in August in1914 for service overseas. The men chosen for this unit had to be physically fit, able to use a gun, and fearless. They were trained for a mere two weeks, and in September of 1914 were sent to German New Guinea to seize and destroy German wireless stations. Of the approximate force of 2000 men, recorded on the Honour Board in our Miners Hall, 161 members in the Australian Expeditionary Force were from Westonia. Many more Australian men and women volunteered in Today, we reflect on that service. We recognize more forces overseas.

Before dawn on the 25th April 1915, the first solders of the Australian and New Zealand Army Corps landed on the shores of the Gallipoli peninsula. The men were part of a British and French led invasion. The allies' mission was to destroy the Turkish guns that were preventing naval ships from reaching and bombarding the Turkish capital, Constantinople. If they succeeded, LEST WE FORGET. Turkey might be forced out of the war and Germany would lose an important ally.

Some 2000 Australians were killed or wounded on 25th April 1915. It was a day of confusion and fear. One solder called it "a day of sorrow" as he remembered the dead and wounded. At Anzac cove the Australians were the first to land. The New Zealanders followed later in the day. They advanced about a mile in some cases, less in others, but they could go no further. For the next eight months, the campaign was a stalemate. In December, the Anzacs were evacuated. By then 8700 Australians and almost 2700 New Zealanders had been killed. They were some of at least 130,000 soldiers on both sides who lost their lives at Gallipoli.

In 1913 Australia had a population of 4 million people. 416,809 Australians fought in World War 1. 58,961 were killed, 166,811 were wounded, 4098 went missing in action or were prisoners of war, and 87,865 suffered some form of sickness. Our World War 1 Honour Board in our Miners Hall records the names of 208 enlisted personnel from Westonia with 15 recorded killed in action. Some who fought and came back home were struck down in 1919 with the Spanish flu epidemic. Many lie to rest in our cemetery.

In 1939 Australians were once again at war. From a population of 6,907,078, 750,000 personnel, men, and women, were conscripted or volunteered to fight. 35,000 Australian men and women were killed. 203 men from Westonia fought in WW2, with 7 individuals from Westonia recorded as killed in action.

Anzac Day has been one of the most important dates on the Australian calendar since 1916. At first, it gave people a chance to Honour the original Anzacs - the Australians and New Zealanders who fought on Gallipoli. Then it became a day for those who served in the first Word War. With Australians experiencing the Second World War, and wars such as the Vietnam War, other conflicts, and peacekeeping operations that have followed, Anzac Day has become an occasion to honour all who have worn our country's uniform in

the British forces prior to Australia sending Australian than a hundred thousand Australian service men and women who have lost their lives in military operations carried out in our country's name. We honour the values that have been invested in the original Anzacs their loyalty, selflessness, courage – and the ways in which later generations such as all gathered here, have measured their own achievements against those of the soldiers who fought in Gallipoli.



April 25th 2024, at 6:00AM Boodalin soak our Anzac Dawn Service was more than we ever expected. Over 50 people rugged up for the chilly morning thankful for the wind protection from the backdrop of rocks. There was a beautiful cloud formation and sunrise to remind us of our military fallen and injured. The sausage sizzle, hot drinks and friendly chatting was a perfect end to the service. Thanks to all those that attended and those that helped make the morning so special.




