

CHANGES TO THE USE OF SHIRE WATER STANDPIPES FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Why are the Standpipes being locked?

Due to the new charges being introduced by the Water Corporation on Local Government standpipes starting from 1 July 2022, Local Governments will need to categorise their standpipes in order to minimise costs. Water will be available for purchase from Community and Commercial standpipes located on Westonia-Carrabin Road, McPharlin Road, Carrabin townsite, Walgoolan townsite, Warralakin Road (Cranleigh), Warrachuppin/George Road, Boodarockin/George Road, Warralakin and Boodarockin (M40).

Which standpipes can I use to purchase water for my property?

All of the above standpipes will be available you can purchase water. Swipe cards will be required to operate these standpipes to purchase water.

Who will have access to swipe cards?

Anyone wanting to access and purchase standpipe water will be able to apply for a swipe card from the Shire Administration Office. Domestic cards (farmers) will be free for the first card and additional cards will be charged at \$20. Commercial cards (Mine/Contractors) will be charged at \$20 upon completion of the required application form.

How much will water cost from the Commercial Standpipe?

They will now be based on four categories shown below:
George/Boodarockin Community 20mm \$3.35 per kilolitre
M40/Boodarockin Community 20mm \$3.34per kilolitre
Walgoolan TS Commercial 50mm \$9.65 per kilolitre
Westonia TS Commercial 40mm \$9.65 per kilolitre
Carrabin TS Commercial 50mm \$9.65per kilolitre
Cranleigh Commercial 40mm \$6.05 per kilolitre
McPharlin Community 25mm \$3.35 per kilolitre
Warralakin East Commercial 50mm \$6.05per kilolitre
Fire-fighting Standpipe –No Annual Fee 100% discount/No Water Use Charge

• In the event of a fire which standpipes can I use for firefighting and how will the standpipes be unlocked?

All standpipes can be used for firefighting. All Fire Control Officers and Fire appliances will have a swipe card at access water. During a Fire emergency, the Shire will then enable the "fire mode" on the commercial standpipe allowing access to water without the need of a swipe card.

• Can I fill up my firefighter free of charge from standpipes for preventing outbreak of fires on my property?

NO....! You should fill up your firefighter tanks with a local water source from your property and not utilise potable water for that purpose. In the event of a fire, you can use a standpipe to fill your unit.

What happens in the event of a declared Water Deficiency Event (Drought)? Can I access water for stock and do I have to pay?

During a declared Water Deficiency Event (drought) made by the State Government, farmers are able to access the water at a concessional rate in accordance with the declaration from any standpipe.
