CAVEATS

- Any incident that has been deemed to be a “domestic incident” has been excluded from this dataset.
- The records contained within the accompanying dataset have been obtained from the WA Police Incident Management System (IMS) and specifically relate to offences that are **reported** to police and **do not** provide details in relation to police attendance / police callouts or demands on WA Police resources.
- Not all offences reported to police (e.g. graffiti or animal offences) will be accurate.
- The counts contained within the dataset relate to the number of *offences* that are reported (and recorded) by police and not the number of *incidents*.
 - An incident relates to the overall criminal activity as an “event”.
 - An offence relates to the number of breaches of the act of legislation.
 - Example: An offender has attended a shopping centre and smashed the front window of 4 different shops. This equates to 1 x Incident at the shopping centre which consists of 4 x damage offences.
- In instances where a part of a locality is shared between 2 (or more) LGAs, the locality (in its entirety) will be allocated to each LGA.

GREAT EASTERN HIGHWAY – WALGOOLAN TO SOUTHERN CROSS

Thank you for your email of 25 March 2021, addressed to the Minister for Transport, Hon Rita Saffioti MLA, regarding the Shire's concerns with the condition of Great Eastern Highway, from Walgoolan to Southern Cross. The Minister has asked that I respond.

The State Government recognises the importance of Great Eastern Highway as part of the strategic road network in Western Australia. As you would appreciate, Western Australia is a vast State and our agency manages one of the world's most expansive infrastructure networks. As such, our regional offices play an integral part in managing and maintaining the network.

I understand that Mr Craig Manton, Main Roads Wheatbelt Regional Manager, has recently written to the Shire to address and clarify the same concerns you raise in your correspondence. I can assure you, the State Government, and its agencies, are dedicated to providing a safe and reliable road transport network.

It is recognised, in some circumstances, that issues arise during the tendering, delivering, and maintenance phases of road projects/management. However, our regional staff are entrusted to provide local and technical advice to other state agencies, local government, transport industry and road users.

I encourage you to continue to liaise with Main Roads Wheatbelt Regional Manager, Mr Craig Manton in regards to the Great Eastern Highway project.

Roads

Condition Assessment of Roads of Regional Significance

A condition survey of all Roads of Regional Significance in the Mid West region, funded through the *State Road Funds to Local Government Agreement*, was completed and results presented to the Regional Road Group. This provides the Group and individual Local Governments with consistent data from which to plan road investment strategies. It also provides initial function evidence in the event that claims for disaster recovery funding are made.

Proposals have been evaluated to conduct condition surveys of Roads of Regional Significance in the Great Southern and Goldfields – Esperance Regions. This work is planned to commence in April.

Guidelines for Road Gravel Supplies in Western Australia

WALGA published guidelines to assist Local Governments source gravel as a road building material. These guidelines provide information on the process for accessing gravel under various types of land tenure and offers information on legislative requirements such as native vegetation clearing, proclaimed water management areas, dieback management, aboriginal heritage and native title considerations, and data support to meet regulatory requirements.

ROADS 2040: Development Strategies for Regionally Significant Local Roads

Feedback was invited and received from Local Governments and Regional Road Groups outside the metropolitan area concerning revised draft Guidelines for Regionally Significant Local Roads. Outside the metropolitan area, only these roads are eligible for Road Project Grant funding through the *State Road Funds to Local Government Agreement*. Once the Guidelines are accepted, Regional Road Groups will be tasked to review their roads and strategies for development of regionally significant roads.

Road Assets and Expenditure 2019/20

Data collection for the 2019/20 Road Assets and Expenditure Report was completed. Analysis and reporting was commenced and the report will be published in May.

Transport and Roads Forum 2021

The Transport and Roads Forum is scheduled for Friday, 14 May 2021 at Crown, Perth.

Funding

State Road Funds to Local Government Agreement

The State Road Funds to Local Government Advisory Committee will meet in mid-April to consider the 2021/22 Local Roads Program. It is noted that the State Government budget has been deferred, and delegates will be seeking support for early approval of the program.

Regional Road Safety Program

A proposed \$35 million program of work to provide sealed shoulders and audible edge lines on about 1000km of Local Government roads in 2021/22 has been developed in conjunction with Local Governments and Main Roads WA. This will be considered for funding by the Commonwealth in April.

Urban and Regional Transport

Regional Roadworks Signage Review

WALGA is contributing to a Regional Roadworks Signage Review initiated by the Minister for Transport. This review will be using local forums and digital platforms to seek direct input from a wide range of stakeholders during April and May.

Road Safety

Road Safety Council Update

The Road Safety Council is focussed on implementation of the new road safety strategy within the current context. Data reflecting pandemic-related factors including freight movements, travel restrictions, public transport use, housing, drug and alcohol use, vehicle sales, the redeployment of Police traffic enforcement and driver behaviour was considered along with the latest results of community attitudes surveys which shows a drop in public concern for road safety.

Preparation for the 2021-22 Road Trauma Trust Account (RTTA) process included consideration of an historical analysis of RTTA funding allocations, projected funding requirements and long-term optimal allocations.

Preferred Supply Program

Approximately half the WALGA Preferred Supplier base of 1,200 companies have been transitioned to the new environment and the process is ongoing.

The existing Road Building Contractors, Materials and Related Services Panel expired on 31 March 2021. Any contractors not renewing their Contract prior to this date will not retain their Preferred Supply status.

In addition to the 20 categories from the previous panel, the new Preferred Supply Panel, Roads Infrastructure and Depot Services will add:

- Public Lighting Install and Maintenance
- Road, Pavement and Footpath Design and Engineering
- Traffic & Transport Engineering.

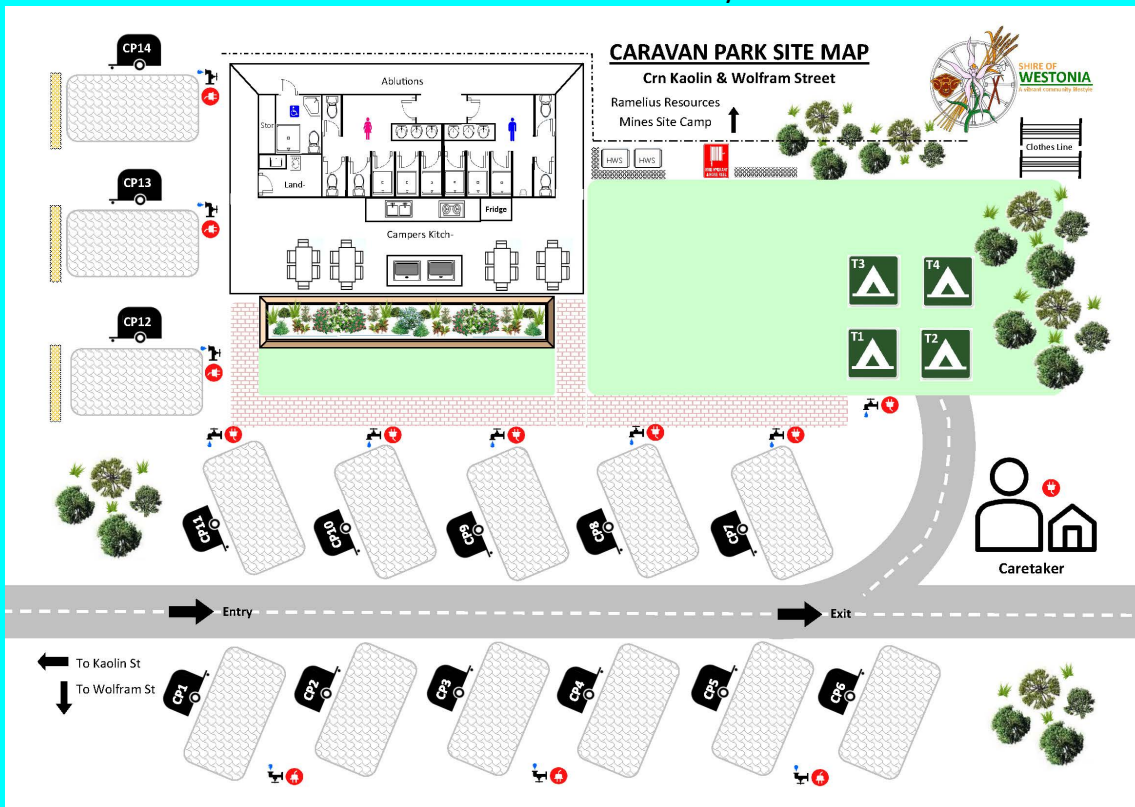

- Caravan Park Upgrade – Project underway works to commence in December 2020 and be completed by April 2021.

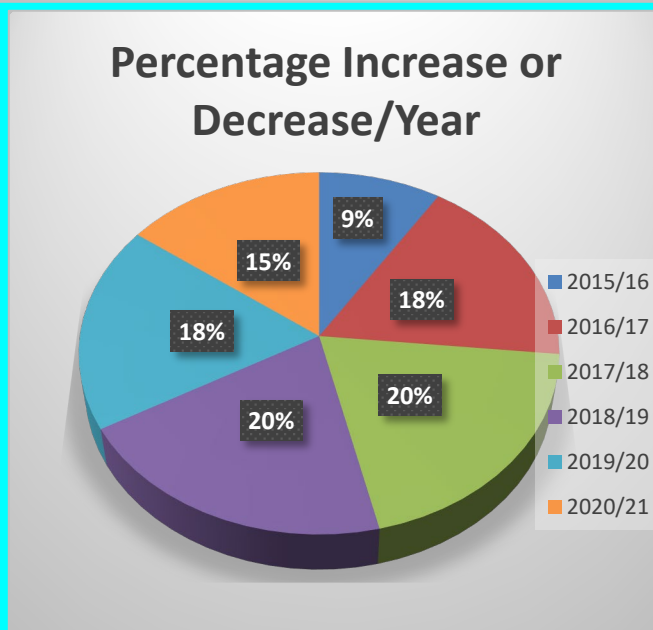
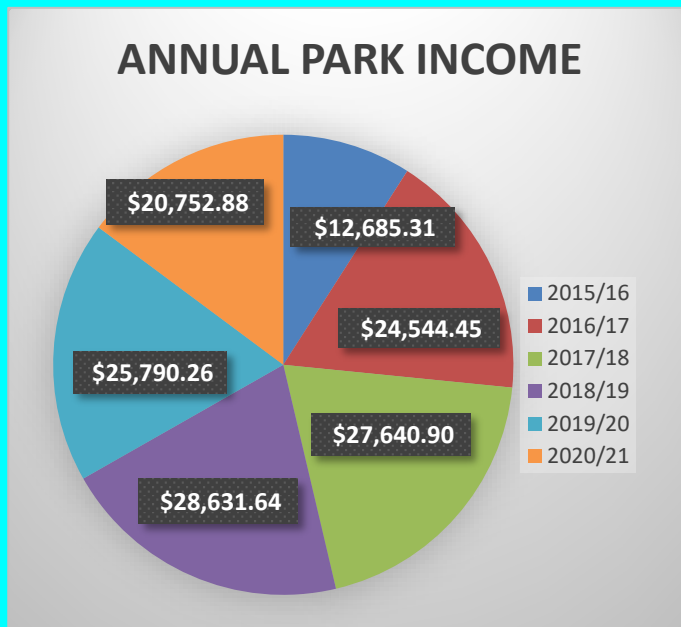
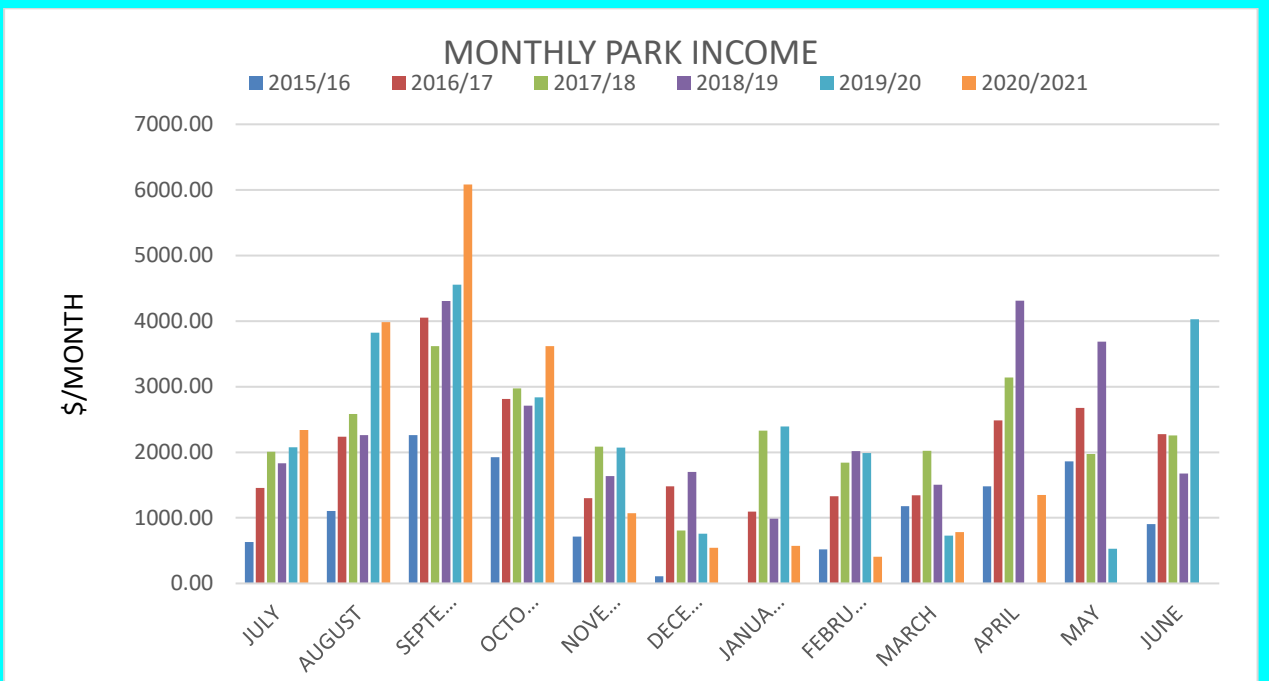

- Storage area restructure

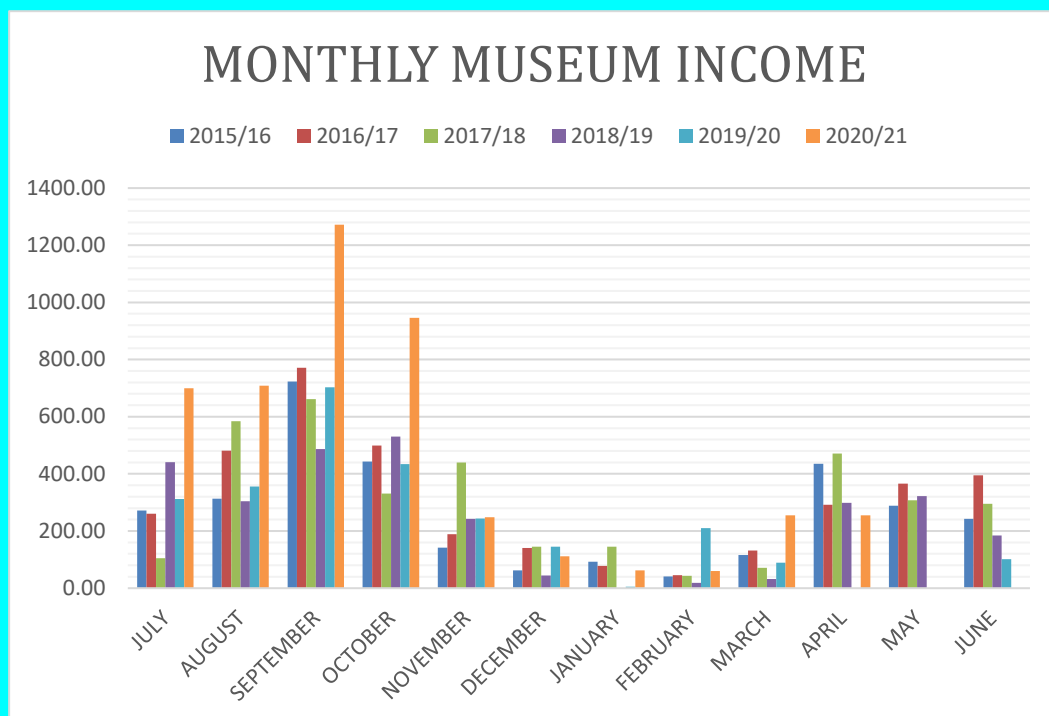

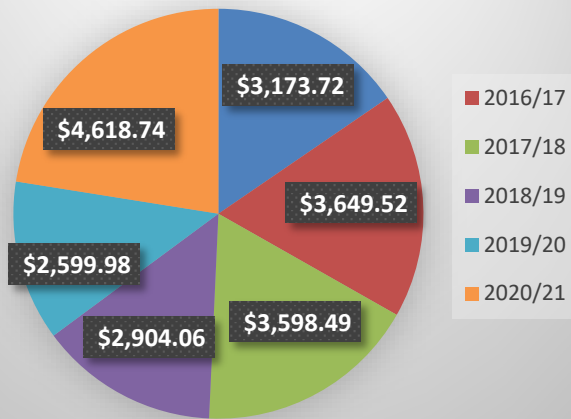

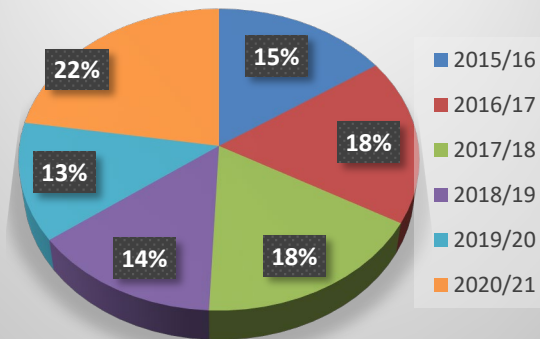

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Research Report – Local Government Metrics of Wellbeing

Governments around the world are seeking more sophisticated methods of measuring community wellbeing beyond traditional economic measures such as gross domestic product (GDP).

To explore measures of wellbeing currently utilised at a national and sub-national level, WALGA hosted a research intern from UWA's McCusker Centre for Citizenship at the beginning of the year.

The intern's research report – [Local Government Metrics of Wellbeing](#) – discusses the purpose and use of wellbeing indices by national and sub-national jurisdictions across three countries (Australia, New Zealand and Canada) as well as exploring future opportunities for Local Government in

Western Australia, notably through the proposed Western Australian Development Index.

During this quarter, WALGA commenced a new sector promotional campaign highlighting the many positive experiences available through Local Government facilities and services that contribute to the quality of life of local communities.

Themed 'What's your happy place?' the campaign employs television, print and online ads, TV news features, two liftouts in the West Australian newspaper and a dedicated website with longform content www.walga.asn.au/happyplace

In addition, an online competition will launch in May in which community members are encouraged to share their own Council-related 'happy place' story for the chance to star in a Happy Place commercial, to be filmed later in the year.

Local Governments are encouraged to support and participate in the campaign through: contribution to print editorial placements; story ideas for news features; and local promotion of the campaign, in particular encouraging community participation in the competition phase for a chance to feature their Local Government in a future advertisement.

NATURAL DISASTER RESILIENCE PROGRAM

WALGA engaged consultants Ernst & Young Australia to produce templates and guidelines to assist Local Governments in developing actions plans to address climate change. A webinar was held on Wednesday, 24 February to introduce Members to these resources. A meeting of the steering group was also held during January at which progression of online training modules was discussed.

SECTOR ADVOCACY BIOSECURITY SENIOR OFFICERS GROUP

WALGA represents the sector on this group, coordinated by the Department of Primary Industries and Regional Development. WALGA raised the following issues at the January meeting: the impact of corella flocks and lack of State Government coordination; concerns with the current structure of Biosecurity Regional Groups and exploring ways to make them more effective.

ELECTRIC VEHICLE WORKING GROUP

WALGA staff represented the sector on the State Government inter-departmental working group at a

meeting in February. The group is tasked with implementing the State Government's electric vehicle infrastructure roll out. A key matter of interest for Members will be Local Governments input into choosing the final locations of recharging stations planned in their Local Government area, WALGA has sought advice on this matter from the group.

WATER CORPORATION CUSTOMER ADVISORY PANEL

WALGA staff represented the sector at a meeting of this group in February, which provides customer advice to WaterCorp on its activities. WALGA raised the issue of the constraints that Water Corporation's policy on asset protection places on Local Government's tree planting program, and the Water Corporation committed to have the relevant officers come to a meeting of the Urban Forest working group to discuss this issue.

REGULATORY STAKEHOLDER REFERENCE GROUP

WALGA represents the sector on this group, coordinated by Department of Water and Environmental Regulation. At the January meeting, the Department provided feedback on

progress being made on meeting its statutory approvals targets, which improved significantly last year. DWER also provided an update on changes to the Environmental Protection Act relevant to the DWER's operations.

ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION AUTHORITY (EPA) STAKEHOLDER REFERENCE GROUP

WALGA represents the sector on this group, with the January meeting focussed on changes to the Environmental Protection Act and the effect on EPA operations.

MEETINGS AND EVENTS

ANTI-SOCIAL BEHAVIOUR IN REGIONAL PARKS

WALGA facilitated a workshop with Department of Biodiversity, Conservation and Attractions and officers from key metropolitan Local Governments to discuss how to address anti-social behaviour in Regional Parks. It was acknowledged that this is a significant problem and a number of key actions were proposed, such as advocacy to increase the penalties for such behaviour and more resources for Local Governments to address this issue.

MOVEMENT AND PLACE WORKING GROUP

WALGA staff worked with the Department of Transport on the Movement and Place Working Group to test the draft Movement and Place Framework. The Framework will be used to classify streets based on an agreed matrix, according to the importance as transport routes and urban planning considerations. This is intended to result in better coordination and more consistent urban planning across Western Australia. Testing is currently focussed on the metropolitan area, but it is intended that the Framework will ultimately apply State-wide.

RESOURCES

HIGH OCCUPANCY VEHICLES (HOV) SURVEY REPORT

WALGA's RoadWise program conducted a sector survey regarding its coordination and management of vehicles with nine to approximately 25 occupants. Research has shown that the crash risk for these types of vehicles and the potential for injury or fatality in a crash are increased compared to other types of vehicles. The consequent report provides baseline information for Local Government management of these

vehicles and identifies where WALGA's RoadWise can provide tools and further advocate to support Local Governments in managing their HOV fleet. The report is available from the RoadWise website.
