Background

In June 2017, the Hon. Minister for Local Government announced the commencement of a review of the *Local Government Act 1995* in two phases.

П

The *Local Government Act* review will introduce changes that will modernise the Act and ensure that local governments are positioned to deliver for the community into the future.

The review will be undertaken in two phases with a consultation paper to be released by the Department of Local Government in November 2017.

The first phase will focus on modernising local government, with a Bill expected in 2018.

Key topics in this phase will be:

- increasing elector participation;
- electronic disclosure (making information more readily available);
- simplifying the disclosure of gifts; and
- reducing red tape provisions

The second phase will focus on delivering for the community with a Bill expected in 2019. Key topics in this phase will be:

- improving behaviour and relationships;
- increasing community participation;
- enabling local government enterprises; and
- improving financial management

Comment

A review of the Act is overdue by Government. Some parts of the Act restrict the ability of local governments to deliver to the community. Other parts have not kept pace with modern technology and community expectations. The five (5) WEROC CEO's then met on Tuesday 5th December 2017 in Merredin to discuss the entire 125 questions presented by the Department of Local Government. A copy of the discussion is attached.

While Council's opinion does not change with the previous WALGA Review, the current review goes into further detail and should be discussed prior to presenting to the Department of Local Government.

Discuss the proposed cartage of gold ore from South Moorine Rock to Westonia for processing at Edna May Operations, Westonia.

Background

The Chief Executive Officer met with Ben Klemasz, Operations Manager with Blue Cap Mining in relation to a proposal to transport gold ore from Jim Symes property (Symes Find) located at South Moorine Rock to Ramelius Resources mill (Edna May Operations) in Westonia.

During discussions Mr Klemasz advised of the proposal to mine and transport 75,000 tonnes of gold ore via road, utilising Moorine South Road, Great Eastern Highway and Westonia-Carrabin Roads to the mine site in Westonia. Hamptons Transport have won the contract to cart the ore and will be carting with the following combinations:

Configuration 1.

Bogie Prime Mover and semi-trailer towing a B Double less than 36.5 metres overall length loaded to AMMS Level 3.

Configuration 2.

Tri Drive Prime Mover and semi-trailer towing a dog trailer less than 36.5 metres overall length loaded to AMMS Level 3.

It is proposed that the job would start on 18th December 2017 and continue until approximately the end of march 2018.

It is envisage that four to six trucks would be employed doing about three return trips per 12 hour shift. This would equate to one truck movement every ninety (90) minutes on average for a 24 hour cycle.

While access to the route is a relatively simple process, the sheer volume of additional traffic on the Shire's Road will increase to 3,500 vehicle movements over the three (3) month period.

This will have an impact on Councils infrastructure and Council will need to monitor and charge accordingly.

The Chief Executive officer is currently discussing the proposal with the Works Manager at the Shire of Yilgarn, Robert Bosenberg to gauge a suitable cost for access to the route. Details will be provided to the Council meeting.

The other issue is that Hamptons have requested AMMS level 3 for concessional loading along the route, of which Council has a policy of only granting AMMS Level 2 access to Shire Bitumen roads. The CEO has delegated authority to grant a higher AMMS Level on a case by case basis, but as this involves up to 3,500 truck movements, that it be referred to Council for consideration.

Summary

Discuss the proposed commencement of the Greenfinch project and subsequent logistical issues pertaining to the road network along Warrachuppin Road.

Background

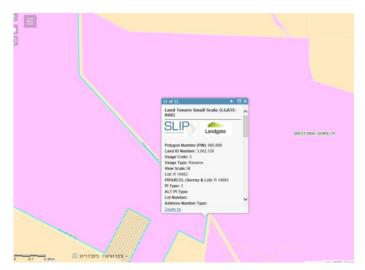
The Chief Executive Officer met with Tim Blythe, General Manager of Edna May Operations at Ramelius Resources on Wednesday 6th December 2017 to discuss Ramelius Resources proposal to commence operations with the Greenfinch project in the mid to later stages of 2018.

In order to do so, Ramelius will need to jump through a few hoops in relation to environmental considerations, design and a potential road realignment.

The proposed Road realignment would commence immediately north of Ashley & Stacey Geier's boundary and snake through the Reserve (14983 – Town Common), west of the proposed pit and bund wall, and joining back to the existing Road (Warrachuppin), approximately 600m north-west of the Geier's property. (see attached map)

Comment

In order to commence the project, Council will need to realign Warrachuppin road, which will include a new survey of the proposed road reserve, possible relocation of utility services (Telstra, Water) and possible new road design (if required).



Obviously, Ramelius Resources have indicated that they will pay for the realignment of the road, Council will now need to instigate the process for a resumption of land under the Land Administration Act.

Statutory Environment

Land Administration Act 1995

56. Dedication of land as road

(1) If in the district of a local government —

(a) land is reserved or acquired for use by the public, or is used by the public, as a road under the care, control and management of the local government; or

(b) in the case of land comprising a private road constructed and maintained to the satisfaction of the local government —

(i) the holder of the freehold in that land applies to the local government, requesting it to do so; or

(ii) those holders of the freehold in rateable land abutting the private road, the aggregate of the rateable value of whose land is greater than one half of the rateable value of all the rateable land abutting the private road, apply to the local government, requesting it to do so; or

(c) land comprises a private road of which the public has had uninterrupted use for a period of not less than 10 years, and that land is described in a plan of survey, sketch plan or document, the local government may request the Minister to dedicate that land as a road.

(2) If a local government resolves to make a request under subsection (1), it must -

(a) in accordance with the regulations prepare and deliver the request to the Minister; and

(b) provide the Minister with sufficient information in a plan of survey, sketch plan or document to describe the dimensions of the proposed road.

(3) On receiving a request delivered to him or her under subsection (2), the Minister must consider the request and may then -

(a) subject to subsection (5), by order grant the request; or

(b) direct the relevant local government to reconsider the request, having regard to such matters as he or she thinks fit to mention in that direction; or

(c) refuse the request.

(4) On the Minister granting a request under subsection (3), the relevant local government is liable to indemnify the Minister against any claim for compensation (not being a claim for compensation in respect of land referred to in subsection (6)) in an amount equal to the amount of all costs and expenses reasonably incurred by the Minister in considering and granting the request.

(5) To be dedicated under subsection (3)(a), land must immediately before the time of dedication be —

(a) unallocated Crown land or, in the case of a private road, alienated land; and

(b) designated in the relevant plan of survey, sketch plan or document as having the purpose of a road.

(6) If land referred to in subsection (1)(b) or (c) is dedicated under subsection (3)(a), a person with an interest in that land (including a person who has the benefit of an easement created under section 167A of the TLA) is not entitled to compensation because of that dedication.

Summarv

Discuss the proposed Redevelopment of the Old Westonia Primary School with the option to create a Caravan Park Overflow.



As Council will be aware, with the closure of the Westonia Primary School and subsequent re-vesting of Reserve to The Westonia Shire for the purpose of "Aged Accommodation and Community purposes", the Shire has been actively being pursuing a redevelopment of the site to include a variety of options:

Project 1 – Camp Westonia

Camp Westonia (Westonia, WA)

This is a proposed partnership with the Shire of Westonia to help establish "Camp Westonia": relocating 40 rooms (comprising 10 x 4 room unsuited units), 1x large kitchen/dinning and common room and 1 x recreation/facilities room to the Old School site to set up as a camp accommodation style complex. This will be utilised for a variety of initiatives, including: schools; bus tours; grey nomads; sport clubs; kids at risk; holiday camp. Activities may include: mine tour; physical activities; educational programs; visit to a working farm.

This project will help "future proof" Westonia following eventual closure of EMO by achieving increased visitation, leading to increased economic activity in Westonia.

Project 2 – Aged Accommodation

Through the CEACA Project, which will provide 75 Independent Living Units (ILU's) across 11 Shire's with Council receiving two (2) houses in this existing project.

Project 3 – Caravan Park Overflow (Semi Permanent)

There is a growing need to provide alternative accommodation for people wishing to stay on a semi- permanent or long-term basis.

There is a section to the north of the existing basketball courts that would be ideal for a 4-6 bay semi-permanent long-term caravan accommodation.

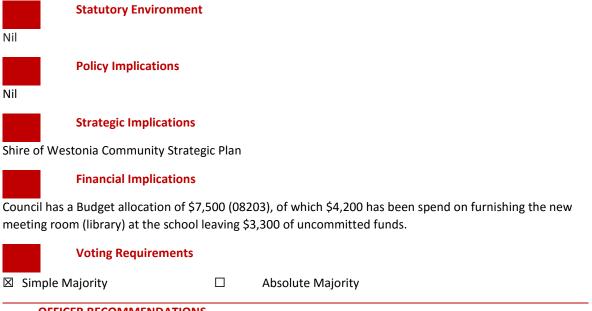
Current Caravan Park laws generally only allow for 3-month terms, so this would allow Council to "move on" or reapply tenants should there be a function on at the School Camp site.

There is currently one semi-permanent tenant residing in the Caravan Park, taking one of the ten (10) sites at the park. Although the income is handy, it does restrict the Park because of its small size.





Management are currently obtaining quotes on installing power bollards to the suggested site, north of the basketball court and as there is existing power to the old craft room, the cost should be relatively low and is hoped to be in the vicinity of \$3-4,000.
