- Disabled toilet drainage will need some major work as tree roots have made their way into the pipes.

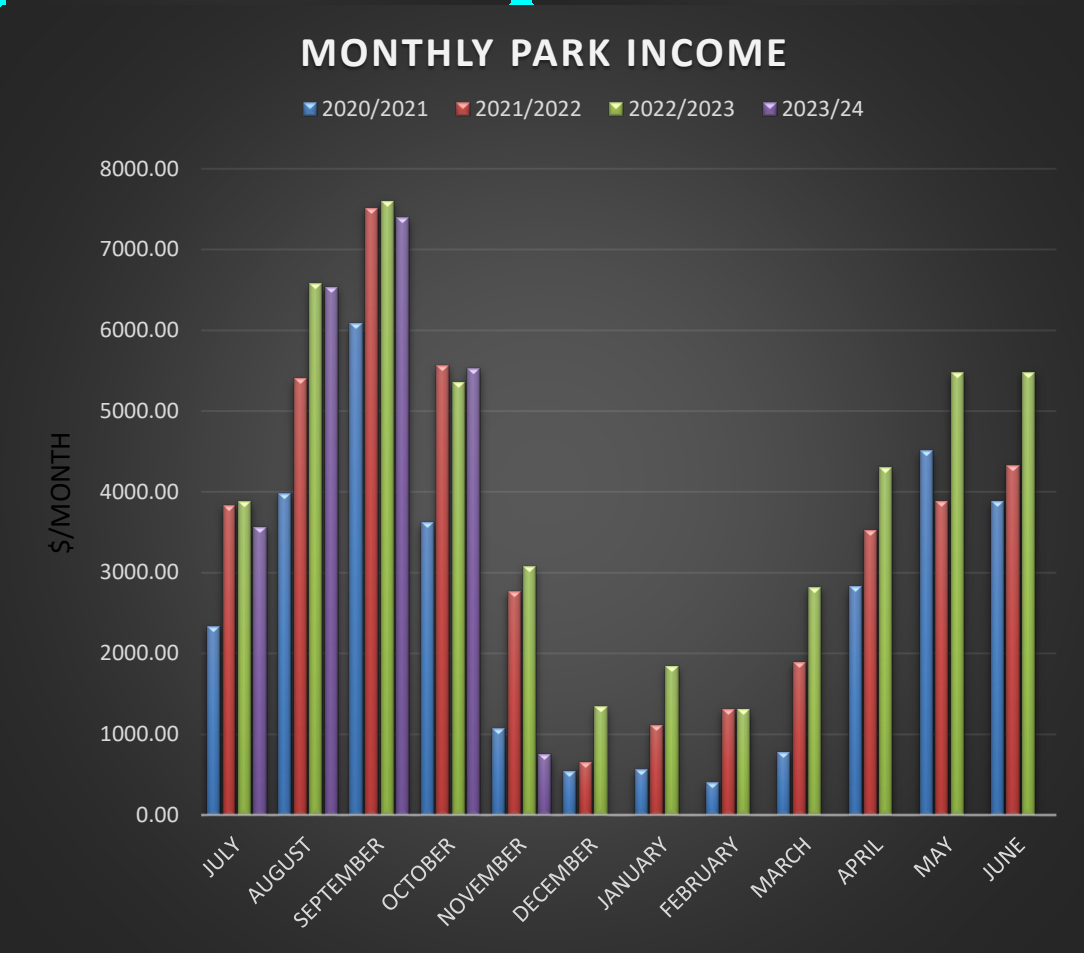
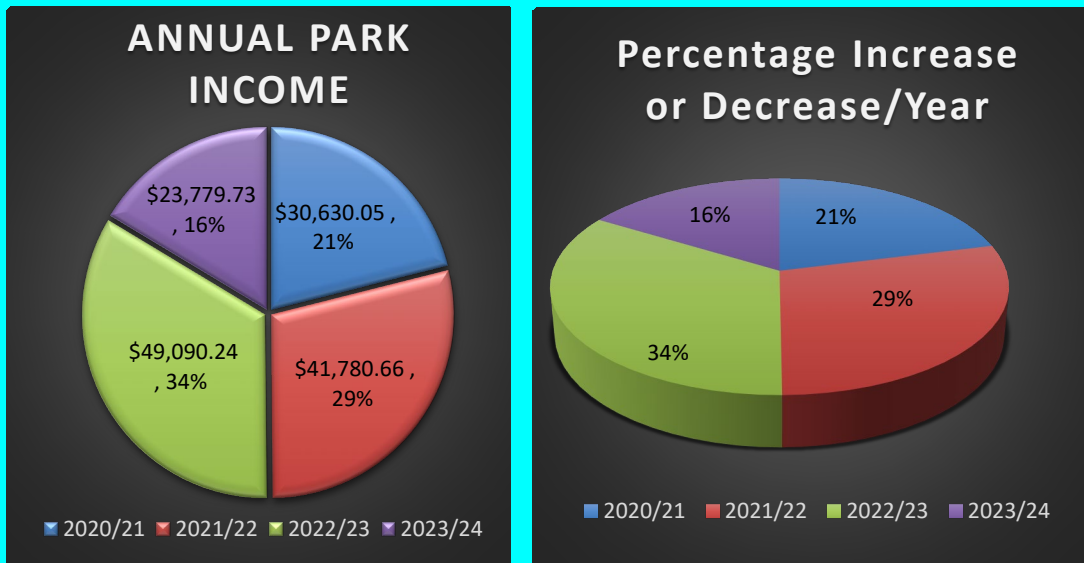
FUTURE PROJECTS

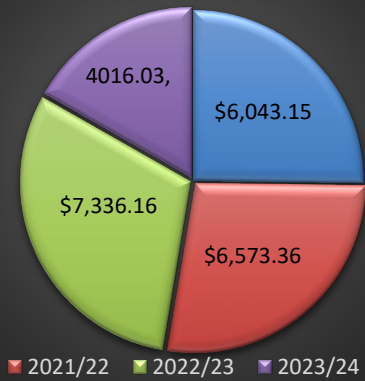

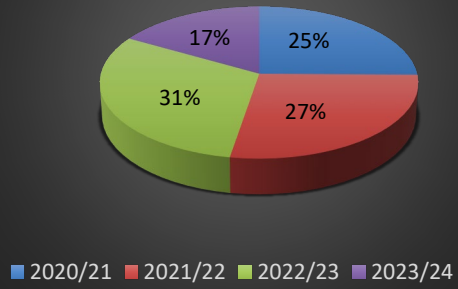

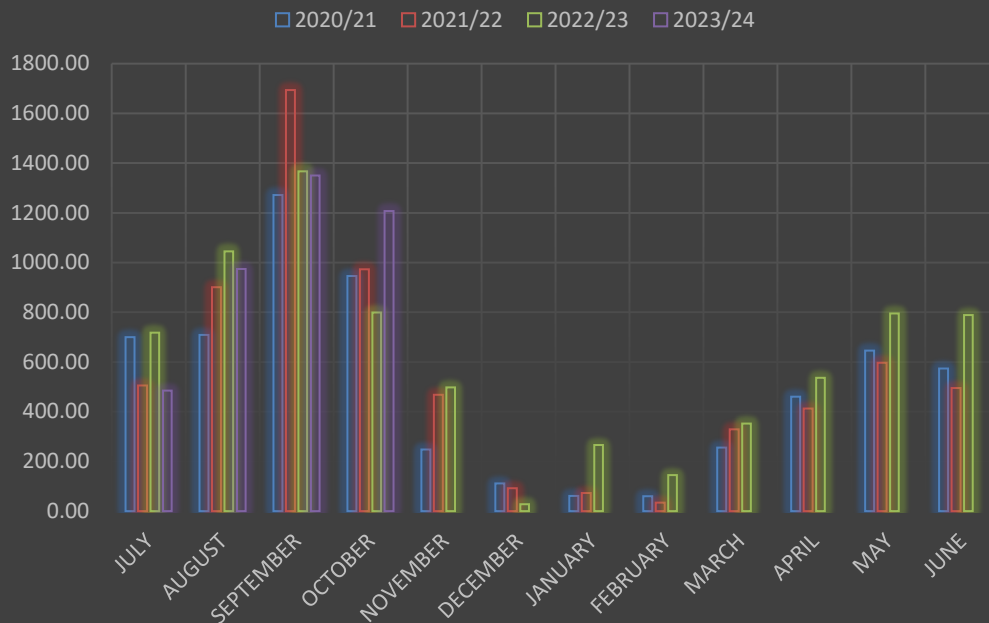
ANNUAL MUSEUM INCOME

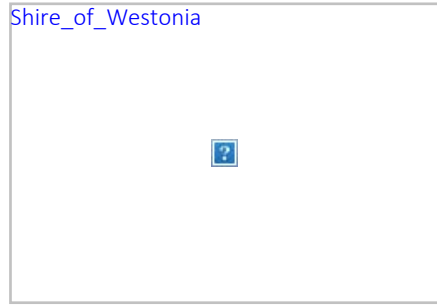

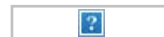

As direct descendants of original settlers, we appreciate the time and resources the Shire of Westonia have allocated to complete our vision for this project.

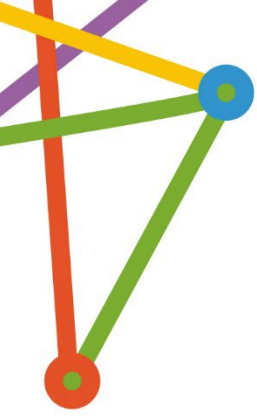



SHORT-TERM RENTAL ACCOMMODATION BILL AND REGISTRATION SCHEME

As you may be aware, the Cook Government is progressing initiatives to better manage short-term rental accommodation (STRA) in Western Australia (WA). The STRA reforms include changes to the State's planning system and the introduction of a state-wide registration scheme, to be administered by the Department of Mines, Industry Regulation and Safety – Consumer Protection Division (Consumer Protection).

I am writing to extend an invitation to all Local Government Authorities (LGAs) throughout WA to consult with Consumer Protection on the Short-Term Rental Accommodation Bill (STRA Bill) and registration scheme and to advise you of the process that will be undertaken.

The aims of the STRA registration scheme are to:

- assist the State and local governments obtain a better understanding of the short-term accommodation sector in Western Australia leading to more informed policy and regulatory responses;
- provide the community with information about what short-term rental accommodation exists in their area; and
- ensure providers are aware of local laws and planning controls.

Consumer Protection is consulting with key stakeholders, including LGAs, to discuss the detail of the registration scheme and the draft Bill so that unintended consequences can be identified and addressed before the Bill is finalised.

The STRA Bill proposes the following:

- Establishment of a Register of premises used as hosted and un-hosted STRA in WA.
- Ban on advertisement of unregistered STRA premises on platforms such as Airbnb, Booking.com and Stayz.
- A process for LGAs to certify registration of a STRA premise as non-compliant with the requirements of local laws, including development approval requirements relevant to STRA.

- Powers for the Commissioner for Consumer Protection to cancel or suspend registrations on the STRA register.
- Powers for the Commissioner for Consumer Protection to provide information held on the STRA register to specified public authorities, including LGAs, for the purposes of regulating STRA and enforcing local laws.
- The ability for the public to be able to search for a property to determine whether it is validly registered as a STRA.

It is expected that the STRA Bill will be introduced into Parliament in early 2024 and the STRA register will commence midway through that year, with registration to be mandatory from 1 January 2025.

LGA webinar and survey

In consultation with the WA Local Government Association (WALGA), Consumer Protection will be hosting a webinar on implementation of the STRA Registration Scheme on 21 November 2023 from 1.30pm. An invitation to attend the webinar will be sent out by WALGA very soon.

The purpose of the webinar will be to share key information on the proposed legislation and how the register is intended to operate. The webinar will also seek feedback from LGAs to assist in building a register that meets the needs of local government.

A more detailed survey targeting various key areas of local government that may be involved in the regulation of STRA, including planning and compliance areas of local government will be sent to key representatives from your LGA following the webinar.

LGA Bulletin

Consumer Protection will assist LGAs with information and updates about implementation of the STRA legislation and registration scheme through a regular bulletin for the local government sector. ROAD WORK DURING A TOTAL FIRE BAN PROPOSED CHANGES (GRADING & BITUMINISING): STAKEHOLDER CONSULTATION

I am writing to inform you that the Department of Fire and Emergency Services (DFES) is now proceeding with targeted consultations involving key community members and industry stakeholders regarding proposed amendments to the regulatory conditions to conduct road work during a Total Fire Ban (TFB).

The purpose of this consultation is to discuss and gather feedback on the proposed amendments to the *Bush Fires Regulations 1954* (BF Regs) pertaining to road work conducted during a TFB.

We value collaboration and intend to work closely with stakeholders and the appropriate authorities throughout this process. To facilitate the consultation, DFES will be conducting information sessions where we will present detailed information about the proposed changes. These sessions will provide an opportunity for stakeholders to ask questions, share their perspectives, and provide valuable feedback that will help shape the final decision.

We encourage all interested parties to participate in these information sessions and contribute their insights in order to create a more effective framework for road work management during TFBs. The Roads, Infrastructure and Depot Services Panel captured the largest annual expenditure totalling **\$41K**

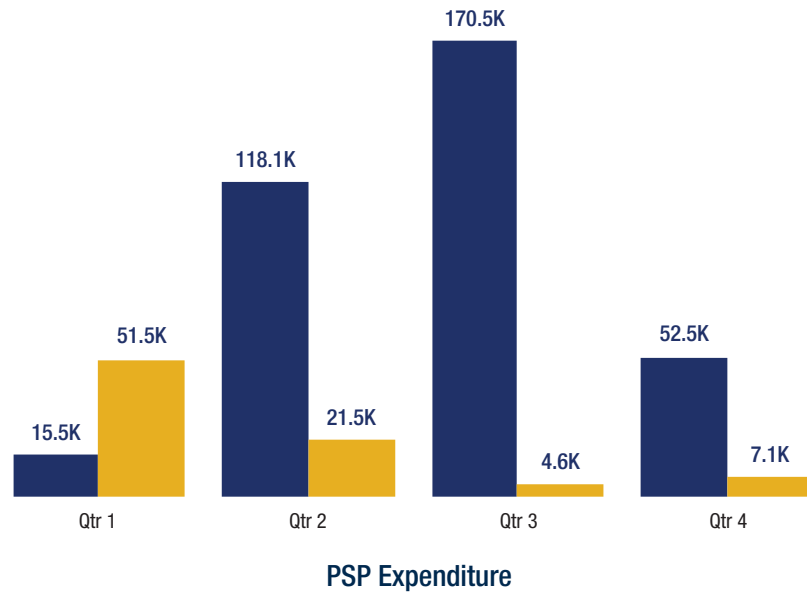
Through the Shire's use of the Preferred Supplier Program, WALGA has received a Management Fee of **\$1K**

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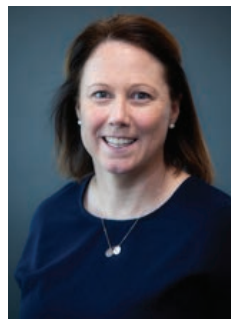
