Notice of Intention to Lay 1080 Poison in the Westonia Common.

Notice is hereby provided that the Shire of Westonia intends to lay 1080 poison baits in the Westonia Common for the control of foxes and rabbits.

The baiting programme is due to commence after Wednesday, 27 March 2019 and be completed by Saturday, 11 May 2019.


Please be advised that 1080 is highly toxic. The consumption of an animal that has ingested a lethal or sub-lethal dose of 1080 poses a serious risk of secondary poisoning to humans and other species. Taking of carcasses, removal of hides, and shooting or trapping animals (for human or animal consumption) is prohibited during the baiting period and for at least 14 days after the completion of the baiting program.

Please ensure children and other persons in your care are restricted from entering the site of baiting. Please restrain your pets, working dogs and stock to avoid the possibility of poisoning through direct baiting or through eating 1080 poisoned animals.

Roadworks

The construction crew are continuing the reconstruction work on a 2.5km section of the Koorda Bullfinch Rd (M040) west of the Warralakin townsite. It is anticipated that this work will be completed by Easter with sealing to commence thereafter.

In conjunction with the new reconstruction works an additional 5.5km of reseal of the M040 will be carried out in the general area of the Warrachuppin intersection.

A Drains and batters program is continuing in the Southern portion of the shire carried out by the Maintenance grader operator.

Talking Rubbish

Residents would have noticed that there has been a major clean-up undertaken of the tipsite. This included the sorting of the recycling products and the construction of a new hole for future household waste.

A concern of Council is that there is an enormous volume of rubbish, particularly whitegoods and farm products that should not be dumped at the site. Cameras have been installed at the tipsite and Council intend to start prosecuting people who are illegally dumping. The target groups will be non-residents and landholders who dump farm type waste at the site.

On a positive note though, Council are extremely happy with the amount of recycling that is being separated and dumped into the recycling station. The bins are constantly full at the time of pick-up by Avon Waste and with the recycling effort by both of the hotels means a huge reduction of glass, plastics, cardboard and aluminium in the main tip.

Just a reminder that the Recycling Centre is located at the rear of the Council Offices

Council are monitoring the volumes and will likely consider an additional skip bin to handle the increased waste. Keep up the good work.

Townsite Clean up

The tourist season is about to crank up again and the Council are keen to continue to present the townsite in as neat and attractive condition as possible.

Recent works has involved the Council undertaking a clean – up of more townsite blocks as well as the demolition of the derelict shed located behind the Old Miners Hall.

Mick the gardener continues to do an excellent job in presenting the gardens and streets in a tidy condition.
