Already contained within the budget are funds to continue with the concrete footpath and kerbing improvements which extend from the Old CWA building down to the Caravan Park, 2. Council are currently applying for some leverage funds from the RAC Reconnect WA Initiative Program which provides funding to assist Local Governments to reimagine and revitalize streets and public spaces. This application closes end of August.

Wolfram Proposed enhancements for Streetscape includes

- Additional Pedestrian Lighting
- Additional seating, shade and bike racks
- Artwork on the COOP windows carried out by local artist
- Mural by local artist on side wall of the little Shop with a completed façade of Westonia Agencies era.
- Corten shade and seating features in front of Old Miners Hall for break out area and to keep the sun off the original timber frontage.
- Some more mini shops adjacent the old CWA building for added interest.

These and other improvements will continue to be upgraded to make our town even better.







Fire Break Orders will be distributed with the annual rates notices to rate payers which will occur in July 2022.

All rate payers are reminded NOT TO THROW AWAY there Fire Break Orders. Rate payers should keep the Orders in a safe place and ensure that they review the Orders to see
