Wheatbelt Medical Student Immersion Program

The Shire of Westonia in conjunction with Rural Health West, Country WA Primary Health Network & Wheatbelt East Regional Organisation of Councils (WEROC) are hosting Medical students from The University of Notre Dame Australia Fremantle School of Medicine to participate in a rural immersion experience in Westonia between the Tuesday 14 March 2023 to Friday 17 March 2023.

The program aims to build student understanding of a rural life. During their stay, students will experience a farm safety course and visit to local general practices, hospitals and schools, community events and Town Specific opportunities. program will give them an understanding of what a country patient experiences when travelling to/from Perth for treatment. If a student is influenced by the program to consider a rural career, that will be the cherry on top.

New Fuel Depot for Westonia

As advised previously the Westonia Progress Association have resolved to construct a new fuel outlet within the townsite to service both locals and tourists who visit town. A 30,000L underground 2 cell tank (15,000L Diesel & 15,000L ULP) has been purchased and is currently being plumbed etc to the new bowser and OPT Card payment terminal systems. The Fuel Depot will be located on Jasper Street behind the Council yards, but will remain a Progress Association asset with profits being generated from the fuel sales for future community use. The Council intend to purchase all of their Fuel requirements from the business and will be undertaking the operational needs for the operation. It is anticipated that the new station will be completed by the end of March.





EXTENSION OF THE PROHIBITED BURNING PERIOD

It is hereby notified for public information per section 17 (7) of the Bush Fire Act, Due to the hot and dry conditions and fuel load in the district, it has been resolved to extend the **Prohibited Burning Period** for a further fourteen (14) days. The Restricted Burning Period will commence 1st March 2023.



BUSHFIRE FIGHTING TRAINING

The Council at its December Council meeting resolved that for volunteers to be included on the Westonia Bush Fire Brigades volunteer register, a minimum standard of training is requiredWhich currently is the BFS Bush Fire Fighter. Fire Control Officers (FCO's) will be required to complete the BFS Advanced Firefighter course.

Council have organized for DFES to visit Westonia during the week of 20 – 24 March to undertake the training locally so as to avoid volunteers undertaking the training in Northam or Perth.

It is intended that Monday 20th and Tuesday 21st March be a (1 day course for both days) for experienced volunteers. It is hoping that at least 30 attendees attend each session.

Wednesday 22nd March will be the Advanced Firefighting course for the FCO's

Thursday 23rd and Friday 24th March is set aside as a 2 x day course for inexperienced volunteers to complete the BFS Firefighting course.
