16TH SEPTEMBER 2023

CBH were generous in providing the venue for our starting point of the 40km Challenge, the residential hut was opened for registrations. Col Coight, (Russell's younger brother) opened the day and after a minute's silence for all those that are no longer with us, a shotgun start and leading the charge was the founding member Mick Fox and his family followed by the Hood Penn gang.

Poole Rd Gravel Pit, after the first leg was completed, participants welcomed a refreshing cold drink and snacks, whilst the front runners waited for the rest of the field to catch up there were plenty of games set up and a little quiz for each team to complete. No one could have predicted the amount of support this event generated it is truly humbling to see the lengths people will go to for charity.

In summary the purpose of this event was to celebrate the 40-year anniversary of the inaugural event, gather the community together to promote our health and wellbeing and to fundraise for some extremely important health programs.

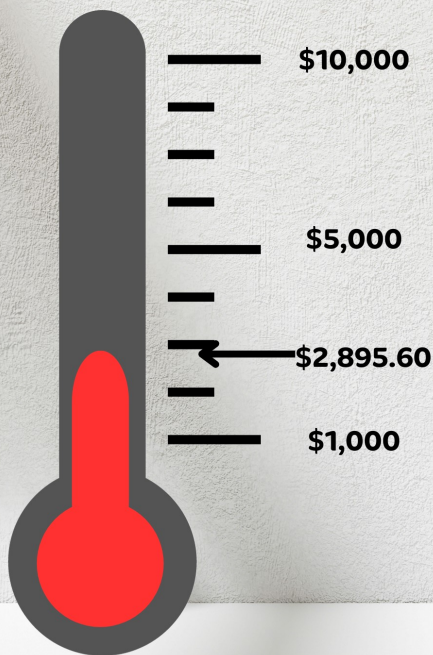

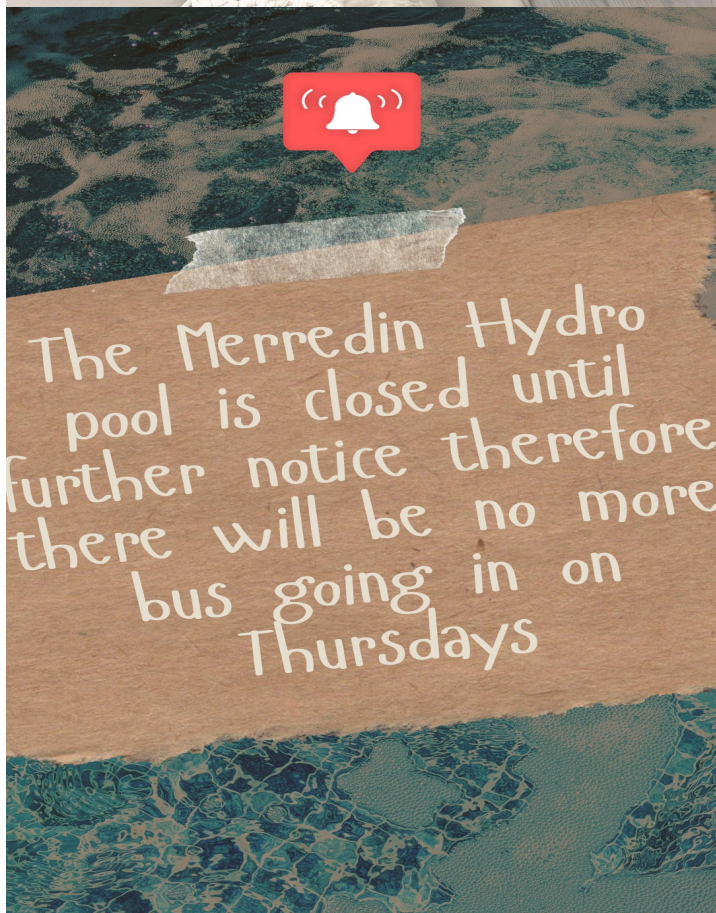
This workshop has been tailored for those who wish to build a creative home collection of their own handmade pottery pieces. In this workshop you will be building your own pinch bowl, a pinch plate, and a jug for your favourite salad dressing or sauce.

For those who are joining us in the daytime session, we will be making a jewellery dish and a pinch bowl to compliment, with the opportunity to make more if you desire.

In the new year you will have the opportunity to complete your home collection with an invitation to a follow-up workshop where you make your own large salad dish to compliment your jug, or, depending on the occasion, use it as a platter to compliment your bowl and plate. Further details will be provided at this years workshop.

Alex later finishes your pieces in her gas kiln, which gives your pottery her unique and exclusive finishing touch. Please allow 6-8 weeks for the drying and firing process before your pieces will be carefully packaged and safely posted out via Australia Post.

All clay, tools, and equipment will be provided and Alex recommends short fingernails and to wear clothes which you don't mind getting dirty, although clay washes out easily.

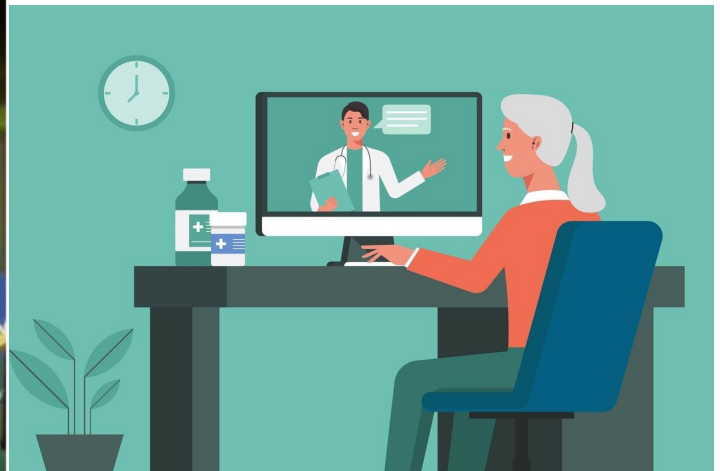

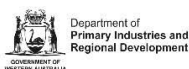

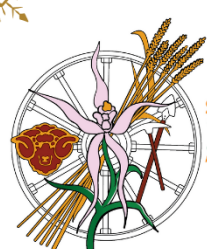
