- 2. Community Action & Wellbeing nominating the wellbeing and HCS program that has been implemented to the community in the past 12 months.
- 3. Community Containers for Change Nominating the outstanding household kerbside monthly pick-up program which is a joint venture between Wheatbelt Containers for Change (Guest's), Council and the Westonia Progress Association and unique to WA.

The judging will be taking place on Wednesday 25th September so Council would be very grateful if residents could make a concerted effort to make sure your yards and frontages are in a neat and tidy state, because the Council will be making a huge effort to make sure the remaining of the town presents itself as best it can.

WARRALAKIN TANK REFURBISHMENT

Recently the Council took over management of the Warralakin (Geelakin) Tank from the Water Corporation.

With the assistance of the Department of Water & Environmental Regulation (DWER) \$ 231,000 funding has been secured so that the old timber and tin roof, which is now derelict to be removed from out of the tank

This will obviously require that the tank be emptied which is currently about a 1/3 full. This will commence immediately.

The refurbishment work will commence third week of September so there will be no access to the tank for several months. The tank will be cleaned out, new steps and platform for access, concrete repairs where required and finally the installation of a floating Hexa - Cover.

Even though this work has a short term impact to the surrounding community the refurbishment will be hugely beneficial to the asset long term. Its still a bit of a disappointment to Mick Fox though, who reckons the bowling club stadium was really earmarked as the new cover for the Warralakin Tank!!


