WARRALAKIN TANK REFURBISHMENT PROJECT

The Warralakin Tank restoration project has commenced with the fabrication of the new galvanized ladder, platform and water level gauge which will be installed on Tuesday 24th September. The following week the ACUS crew will be mobilized onsite to remove the roof and debris from the tank. This will be in coordination with Council workforce who are tasked with the transport of tin to waste and the timber back to Westonia townsite. Any of the products that are salvageable will be retained for future use. Mid-October will see the crew from National Concrete Solutions (NCS) who will mobilise from Albury NSW to undertake the concrete repair and sealing component of the project. Once this is the Council will completed repair catchment wall on the rock and open the inflow and hope for a summer thunderstorm. Once there is a body of water in the tank the final contractor Earth Water & Infrastructure will install the Hexa-Cover floating devices.
