

FIRE BREAKS

Fire breaks and all mandatory property maintenance (See Fire Breaks & Hazard Reduction Notice for details) to be installed and maintained between

1 NOVEMBER-30 APRIL

CAMPING AND COOKING FIRES

Camping and woodfire cooking fires may be lit at a persons permanent home or residence provided it is contained within a purpose built structure and the Fire Danger Rating for the District is not "High" or above.

Refer to Shires Campfire Information found on the Shires website for all terms and conditions.

RESTRICTED BURNING PERIOD

A permit is to be obtained from a Fire Control Officer prior to hurning

> 16 SEPTEMBER—31 OCTOBER 15 FEBRUARY—31 MARCH

PROHIBITED BURNING PERIOD

1 NOVEMBER—14 FEBRUARY

During a Total Fire Ban (TFB) you must not light any fire in the open air, conduct hot works such as welding or grinding, operate an internal combustion engine on or near vegetation, or conduct any activity likely to start a fire.

Some exemptions may apply to business or agricultural industries- Visit the Department of Fire & Emergency Services Website for more information
