

Slow-Cooker Beef Stew

Prep: 25 min. Cook: 7 hours



Ingredients


- 1-1/2 Pounds potatoes, peeled and cubed
- 6 Medium carrots, cut into 1-inch lengths
- 1 Medium onion, coarsely chopped
- 3 Celery ribs, coarsely chopped
- 3 Tablespoons all-purpose flour
- 1-1/2 Pounds beef stew meat, cut into 1-inch cubes
- 3 Tablespoons canola oil
- 1 Can (14-1/2 ounces) diced tomatoes, undrained

Instructions

- 1 Can (14-1/2 ounces) beef broth
- 1. Layer the potatoes, carrots, onion 1 Teaspoon ground mustard and celery in a 5-qt. slow cooker. Place flour in a large shallow dish. 1/2 Teaspoon salt Add stew meat; turn to coat evenly. In a large skillet, brown meat in oil in 1/2 Teaspoon pepper batches. Place over vegetables.
- 2. In a large bowl, combine the 1/2 Teaspoon dried thyme broth. mustard. tomatoes, salt. pepper, thyme and, if desired, browning sauce. Pour over beef.

 Minced fresh thyme, optional Cover and cook on low for 7-8 hours, or until the meat and vegetables are tender. If desired, sprinkle with fresh thyme before serving.
