This year the Progress Association successfully put in a wheat crop over 262 hectares. It has been truly pleasing to see the community rally together to make this project happen. From start to finish, people generously offered their time, machinery and expertise, creating a real sense of shared purpose and pride.

This marks the first crop we have grown for the Progress Association in 10 years. After such a lengthy break, there was a lot of groundwork needed before we could even get the seed in the soil. Old fencing was removed, paddocks were burnt and cleaned, rocks were picked and the land was ploughed, all in preparation for a fresh start. The hard work paid off. The crop averaged 1.4 tonnes per hectare, a great result for the season and a credit to everyone involved.

A very big thank you to our sponsors for their support. Merredin Rural Supplies and Nutrien Merredin contributed to the chemicals for the crop, while AFGRI and McIntosh & Sons generously provided demo machinery to assist with operations.

On behalf of the Progress Association and the Westonia community, we extend our sincere thanks to all volunteers for donating their time, machinery and equipment, and to our sponsors for backing this project. The success of this crop is a direct reflection of our community spirit. Without the contribution of so many, none of this would have been possible. Thank you

What A year!!

2025 has certainly flown by but not without a heap of milestones and achievements for the community. These include

- The Coopers Garage Museum
- Completion of the Swimming Pool Kiosk and landscaping
- Community Hub good progress on the Warm Water Pool, Community Garden and Men's Shed project to be finished early in the new year.
- Expansion of Health Clinic including the extension of the Nurse Practitioner service
- Demolition of the Old Walgoolan Hall
- Successful Community Events including the Wessy on the Green, Seniors Sundowner and Xmas Markets

Corella Cull

Council would like to notify that a Corella Cull will be taking place for a period over the next few months to keep the bird numbers down.

Corellas are invasive birds which destroy infrastructure, habitat for native birds and trees so shooting will take place on the town extremities from a Council vehicle when safe to do so.




